About Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing

- Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing, Inc. (PHWFF) began in 2005 serving wounded military service members at Walter Reed Army Medical Center returning from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan.
- Since then, PHWFF has expanded nationwide
- PHWFF currently has 223 programs serving disabled veterans and disabled military service personnel from 45 states. Each program is managed at the local level by volunteers who work in partnership with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) facilities, Department of Defense (DOD) military installations, Warrior Transition Units (WTU) and other institutions. PHWFF has 19 geographic regions throughout the United States.
- We are dependent on tax-deductible, charitable donations and the help of numerous volunteers to meet the educational, equipment, transportation, and related needs of its participants.

Trip Overview (3 days / 2 nights)


- Time Frame Mid June to Mid July (Currently targeting June 19-23)

 - The more physically abled will hike the trail to the falls and fish along the way
















Where We Will Fish


- Originates as two streams in Yosemite
 - The 7-mile (11 km) Lyell Fork rises at the Lyell Glacier below Mount Lyell
 - The 5-mile (8.0 km) Dana Fork originates between Mount Dana, and Mount Gibbs, and flows west.
 - Converges near Tuolumne Meadows in Yosemite @ the confluence of the Dana Fork and the Lyell Fork.

HIGHWAY 120








Carlon Falls

- Access from Evergreen Rd
 - Head W. on 120 towards Big Oak Entrance of Yosemite
 - Turn Left on Evergreen Rd before getting to Big Oak Entrance (Like going to Hetch Hetchy)
 - Access parking lots on both sides of the road before crossing the bridge
 - Can park next to the bridge if available
 - Trail to Carlon Falls is on the right, after crossing the bridge






The Trail Up To Carlon Falls



Along The Trail To Carlon Falls












Where We Will Stay - Yosemite Lakes Groveland, CA
